**Linda Hillman**, President of the Rensselaer County Regional Chamber of Commerce, as moderator of our panel discussion.

**Judith Saidel**, Associate professor in the Department of Public Administration and Policy at University of Albany, who is well known in tech circles. Her extensive study of the tech-driven boom and post-boom period in Austin, Texas will help us understand the human side of economic development.

Entrepreneur **Eric Burnett** will bring his personal experience as CEO of a start-up technology company that is focused on research in its effort to applying advanced nanotechnology applications in products. His company, Auterra, Inc., formerly Applied NanoWorks, has recently moved to the Saratoga Tech + Energy Park. Eric will be familiar to many, as he and his family volunteer for a number of not-for-profits in the region.

The transfer of executives from across the country generally requires the transfer of their families as well. Tech Valley Connect is a service that helps "trailing spouses/partners" with their integration into new communities. This means helping them identify services provided by not-for-profits and ways they may get involved. **Angela McNerny** is the director and will share some of her recent experiences and how they are preparing for the influx.

Our program will also include an executive from a major Tech Valley company, such as Global Foundries.
